ORGAN CORNER

Throughout most of the nearly 190 years of First Presbyterian's ministry in Strasburg, music and singing have been supported by an organ. We know that the early instruments were reed organs, where the organist produced sound by treading on pedals to pump the bellows. Trustee minutes from 1923 indicate that the pump organ in use was electrified, thus eliminating the need to move the bellows by foot pressure.

In 1948 a committee was challenged at a congregational meeting to contract for a small Moeller pipe organ (at a cost of \$4825), which was installed and dedicated in 1950. This instrument required the pipes to



be located in the ceiling area, which over time proved unsatisfactory. By 1982 the Trustees and Session authorized the purchase of a new electronic organ. Fred Buch of Buch Organ Company in Ephrata, designed and installed the new instrument at a cost of \$32,906. The dedication was in May and the dedicatory recital offered by David Craighead was on November 12, 1982 – all occurring within the 150th birthday of the church. An interesting side note is that David Craighead, a nationally recognized organist and teacher at Eastman School of Music, was born in Strasburg while his father was pastor at First Presbyterian.

We now find ourselves in the same situation of nearly 40 years ago where the current instrument is failing and should be replaced. The committee working to recommend a future replacement includes Peter Witmer, Chairman; Chris Henkel, organist; Ray Reeder, choir member; Donna Burkholder and Linda Lawrence, members; Jon Knauss, contemporary worship leader and Pastor Bronkema.
