Sermon Notes			

ORGAN CORNER

Question -

Did the organ search committee consider investigating the acquisition of a pipe organ as well as a digital instrument to replace our aging church organ?

The answer to the question is YES. Indeed in the 1930's through early 1980"s, the church did have a small pipe organ in the former sanctuary (before renovation). However, pipe organs require a large space for pipes. Each sound (stop) on the organ requires a separate pipe for each key – 66 various pipes for one sound source. A basic pipe organ would require at least 25 – 30 ranks of pipes. Normally organ chambers are built and reserved for that purpose. First Presbyterian does not have such a space. To consider a pipe organ would require losing most of the platform area, either for chambers or standalone cabinetry. In fact, the current location of electronic speakers which serve the organ is at the front of the sanctuary located above and behind the choir area and is only large enough for the required speakers – a depth of less than 2 feet.



Nevertheless, we did make contact with several local organ builders and the Organ Clearing House to determine if there might be an instrument seeking a second home that would not be an enormous expense and could be considered in some configuration. Again, the dilemma involved finding such an instrument, arranging to have it transported and then rebuilt in our space. There would be no certainty of when all those details might come together. Knowing we were in a critical stage of need to replace the current organ seemed to suggest another reason why this this avenue should not be pursued.
