Dear FPC family and friends,

Happy Thanksgiving! I remember well our first Thanksgiving together as a married couple in Italy. We invited a handful of families to our house for an American Thanksgiving meal. I had to go to the neighborhood butcher to order a turkey. I asked for a 13 pound turkey and he gave me a 13 kilo turkey, it was about 25 pounds and when I held it up, it was terrifying. We butchered it and used 4 ovens to bake it, and it turned out great. That was way back in 1995, 30 years ago.

What are some of your best Thanksgiving memories over the years? The Psalms are filled with thanksgiving for what God has done and for what God promises to do for us throughout our lives. We are thankful for God's faithfulness which endures forever. Look back at that phrase which is repeated in a number of psalms. The steadfast love of the Lord will endure forever. A lot has happened since my last enews to you. Here is a listing in no particular order. Session approved the renovation of the fellowship hall bathrooms which should take place around January and February. Walter Kondratowski was approved as a candidate at the last Presbytery meeting setting him up for potential ordination in February, if the way be clear. Emma Wilson was elected by Presbytery to be a YAAD, which is a Young Adult Advisory Delegate, to the PC(USA) General Assembly in Wisconsin in the summer of 2026.

Session approved the budget for 2026. You can find paper copies of it in the foyers as you leave or enter the sanctuary. It may shock you that the budget is increasing this year. Your giving has been tremendous, but that is not why it is going up. The majority of the increase is in mission, which is exciting, and specifically mission involving youth, which is equally exciting. Another increase is that last year we did not take into account the cleaning crew we hired at the end of the year and it is significantly more expensive than having a staff person do the cleaning.

Also, at Session mission and finance reported on the survey which they took of the congregation. Look for the next enews to break it down, maybe next week. It is helpful to hear what you think. The vast majority of you do care strongly about what we do as mission here at the church, so that is encouraging.

We had a record number of people show up on Monday to decorate the church. Yes, the church looks great, but what a great time we had putting things up and eating pizza. Have a Happy Thanksgiving, and don't ever forget to give thanks to God for all of God's benefits.
